# **Types of Statements**

- Statement of Purpose
- Statement of Interest/Intent
- Personal statement
- Diversity statement

Prompts tend to have overlapping but somewhat different requirements, depending on school or program

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Read the prompt!

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## **Overview of Personal vs Diversity Statements**

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Universally required

Focus on research and academic background

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May be optional

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#### **Personal Statements**

Universally required

Focus on research and academic background

#### **Both**

Personal narratives

How past experiences shaped you

#### **Diversity Statements**

May be optional

Focus on experiences and commitments to diversity

# **Additional information on Diversity Statements**

- Two main strategies
  - How you have promoted justice, diversity, equity, and inclusion in your community
  - How you have overcome obstacles related to aspects of your identity

#### **Statements and Trauma**

Be cognizant of triggering emotions that may come up as you craft your statements

How Applying to Grad School Becomes a Display of Trauma for People of Color

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Please highlight your academic **preparation and motivation**; **interests, specializations and career goals**; and **fit** for pursuing graduate study at UC Davis.

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• Preparation and motivation may include your academic and research experiences that prepare you for this graduate program (for example: coursework, employment, exhibitions, fieldwork, foreign language proficiency, independent study, internships, laboratory activities, presentations, publications, studio projects, teaching, and travel or study abroad) and motivation or passion for graduate study.

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- Interests, specializations, and career goals may include your research interests, disciplinary subfields, area/s of specialization, and professional objectives.
- **Fit** may include how **your preparation**, **experiences**, **and interests match the specific resources and characteristics** of your graduate program at UC Davis. Please **identify specific faculty** within your desired graduate program with whom you would like to work and how their interests match your own.

#### Personal History and Diversity Statement:

The University of California Davis, a public institution, is committed to supporting the diversity of the graduate student body and promoting equal opportunity in higher education... We invite you to include in this statement how you may contribute to the diversification of graduate education and the UC Davis community.

The purpose of this essay is to get know you as an individual and potential graduate student. Please describe how your personal background informs your decision to pursue a graduate degree. You may include any educational, familial, cultural, economic, or social experiences, challenges, community service, outreach activities, residency and citizenship, first-generation college status, or opportunities relevant to your academic journey;

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This essay should complement but not duplicate the content in the Statement of Purpose.

#### **Brainstorm themes**

What kind of narrative theme would you thread through your personal statement?

#### Examples:

- Natural history has become underrated in ecology, but that's what sparked my interest and what I want to bring into my research
- My interest in nature vs nurture due to my background as an adoptee motivated me to study interactions between genes and the environment

#### **Statement structure**

- No one "right" format
- Chronological order is usually good
- Read lots of examples!

#### **Statement structure**

#### One method:

# Hook

- Introduction
- Why do you want to go to grad school?

# Body

- Relevant experiences
- Your science

## Conclusion

- Future goals
- Why this specific program?

## Do's and Don'ts of statement writing

#### Avoid...

Generic statements

Listing or summarizing your resume

Long intro about growing up doing nature activities

Oversharing

#### Instead...

Be specific and describe your experiences

Highlight key experiences and why they were important to you

Concise intro about something unique to you

Write about what motivates you to do research/go to grad school

# **General writing tips**

- Keep essays concise, clear, and free of errors
- Be authentic but don't overshare
- Write about topics that are unique and meaningful to you
- Thread your theme(s) throughout the statement(s)
- The statements should complement but not repeat each other

# **Advice from professors**

"What have been the major factors that have shaped you as a person? What is your ambition and why?"

"Avoid narratives that start with 'when I was a kid ...' just stick to recent experiences that motivate a PhD"

"A good statement shows personal growth, motivation, and maturity. It can include challenges overcome to show resilience and determination. It's an opportunity to show communication skills, therefore it ought to be structured like an essay. I want an understanding of who the person is, though, so it doesn't have to be completely formal and dry."

"Not too personal -- emphasize why this part of you feeds into your professional self."
